The Digital Challenge

At the Community Foundation for Northern Ireland, we empower local communities, and grassroots organisations with the tools and training they need to thrive.

This year, we're launching the **Inspiring Growth Fund** to bridge the digital divide in the community and voluntary sector and we invite your business to be part of this bold step forward.

Recent research by the Community Foundation for Northern Ireland has found that many community organisations still struggle with accessing technology and skills to build for the future.

Many organisations surveyed highlighted challenges including:

- **Outdated or no technology**
72% of charities find the cost of equipment and ongoing

maintenance a barrier to adopting a digital culture.

- **Limited access to digital tools**
73% of charities need support in sourcing hardware and software.
- **Lack of training in platforms**
41% of charities require training on cybersecurity and 47% on AI.
- **Inability to reach people online**
37% of charities require training and support in social media management and 28% in website management.

This digital gap limits the capacity of community organisations to serve communities.

We want to change that by providing grants that give people the time to learn, share and access much needed resources to bridge that gap.

Fund Goals

The aim of the Inspiring Growth Fund is to enable community organisations to strengthen their capabilities in several key areas:

- **Enhancing** skills and knowledge through training and digital literacy programmes for nonprofit staff and volunteers
- **Building** cyber security and tech support to ensure safe, sustainable systems
- **Ensuring** digital tools are accessible including software, hardware, AI and other necessary platforms
- **Website and communications support** for under-resourced groups

With digital skills lacking in the sector, it is important that those organisations delivering vital services are supported to access digital technology and avail of the opportunities the likes of AI may bring.

This capacity-building approach ensures that community organisations can adapt and thrive.

Not only will this process make organisations more sustainable but it will make a lasting impact on the individuals and communities they serve.

Custom Partnerships	A more tailored fund opportunity to meet your CSR goals

Match Funding

At the Community Foundation for Northern Ireland, we are in the unique position of being able to match your giving. For donations of £5,000 or over (dependent on fund availability) we will match that donation at a rate of 50% or £25,000.
